1. CALL TO ORDER - The Meeting was called to order at 7:00 PM.

2. Approval of the Minutes of January 21, 2025, Meeting. Steve Price asked for motion to approve the minutes, Neil Sokoler 2nd the motion. All Members present approved of the minutes.

PUBLIC COMMENT.

- Steve Price asked, any update on finding who hit the fire hydrant? Jeff, whenever there is damage to anything (a public system) and we identify the person, we have to prove this incident happened by this person. Risk management will find out the cost and make sure the person responsible will financially replace the damaged item(s). The cost is somewhere around \$1500 plus any other damage. Could be up to 1,000 gallons of wasted water. The person who has been found has the right to contest.
- What is the status of the Director of Water & Sanitation. We have another candidate who has been chosen to be the Director, and they will be starting at the end of August. Jeff is the interim acting Director.

 - Ending balance on the financial pages is very stable. Revenue vs. how much time staff is putting in, it looks very good. The aging of your system is going very well. Down the road we may want to put some money away for your future aging system over time.

B. PROJECTS

CAPITAL PROJECTS – Status Report provides regular reporting on the status of active capital projects within the district

 Steve asked about water on the construction project. To date we've spent \$555,771 is for the Reservoir that is not going to take place anymore. Correct, we are going to leave everything the way it is and if we get a larger Grant we can take up where we left off. More is going to be spent in addition to the \$555,000? A little more will be spent to close out this project. SEQUA plus is going to be mitigated to ensure we are going to take advantage of federal/state funds, should they become available to us. Homer, can you explain about the creek crossing waterline between Balboa and Stagecoach. This project is still going to be designed. Our plan is to get a design and reassess as a District to decide if we will continue with the project to get a better idea of the costs to replace that line. There has been a lot of erosion more so than what we thought with the existing soils. We will know more when we get a better design. This is an area where we have had longterm pressure concerns. In the future we may continue with this even if we do not continue with the reservoir.

C. O&M UPDATE

WATER SALES TO BUDGET, SYSTEMS STATUS AND AMI

- Water Efficiency-we are very close to tracking based on the weather and conditions.
- Mainline Leaks-None in 2025
- Service Leak-1 in 2025. At someone's house, break in the system. Usually on the private side of the system. What we have has been very minor.
- AMI Report, District 17 is doing better than any other district. North of 50% would be great. We will still try to reach out to people.



Bell Canyon Water Service Area







 - Imports water from SWP and the Colorado River








Bell Canyon State Water


State Water Project Allocations

Bell Canyon vs. CWMD Historical Rate Increases






Bell Canyon Reserves vs. Cash Flow with 10% Rate Increase FY2026 - FY2031






Bell Canyon Proposed Fixed Charge Meter Rate Comparison





Operations & Maintenance – Water Efficiency


District 17 Monthly Demand (AF)









Percentage of Registered Accounts per District as of August 2025








